

1 Peter 1:20-21

2 Corinthians 5:14

God is the one who justifies; who is he one who condemns? Christ Jesus is He who died, yes, rather who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, who also intercedes for us."

Rev 5:9-10 "And they sang a new song, saying, `worthy are You to take the book, and to break its seals; for You were slain, and did purchase for God with Your blood men *from* every tribe and tongue and people and nation. And You have made them to be a kingdom and priests to our God; and they will reign upon the earth.""

Eph 5:25-27 "Husbands, love your wives, as <u>Christ</u> loved the church and gave himself up for her, that

he might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word, so that he might present the church to himself in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish." John 10:15 "I lay down My life for the sheep." According to this verse, who did Christ give His life for? The answer is clear for the sheep. By implication, we rightly infer that He therefore did not lay down His life for the goats.
