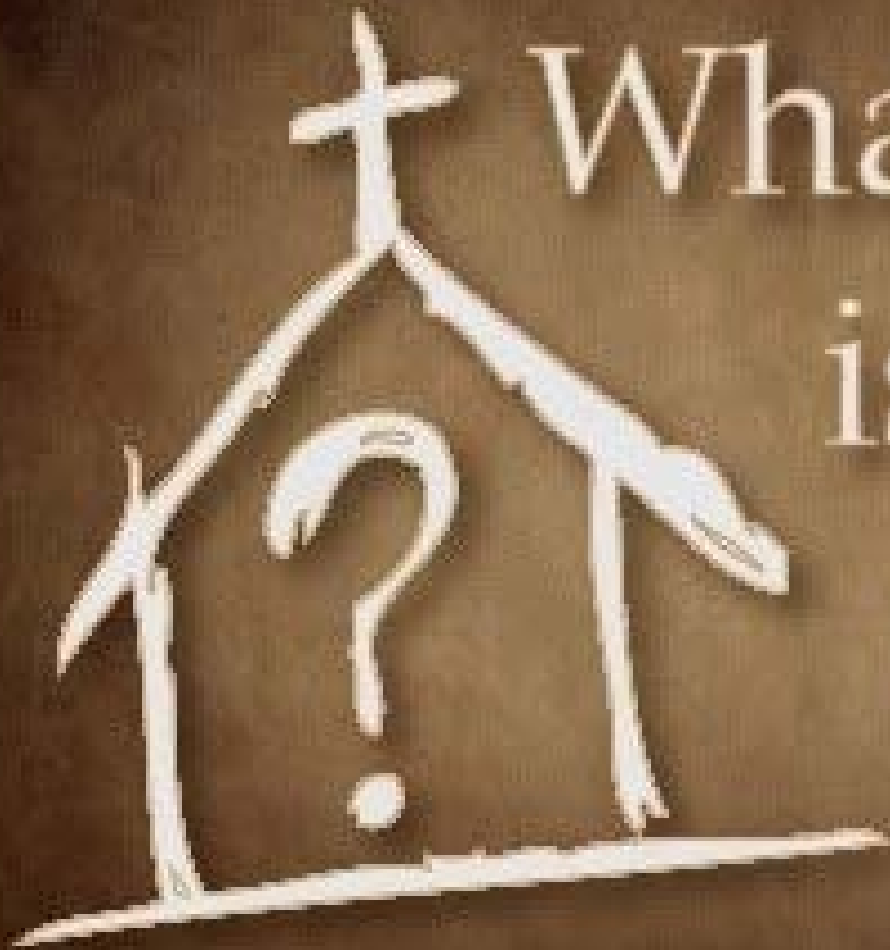
The Greatest Letter Ever Written!
