The Greatest Letter Ever Written!

1. He forgives our transgression (Ps. 32:1,5).

2. He covers our sin (Ps. 32:1; Rom. 4:7).

3. He does not charge us with iniquity (Ps. 32:2; Rom. 4:8).

4. He removes our sins from us (Ps. 103:12; John 1:29).

"For as high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is his love for those who fear him; as far as the east is from the west, so far has he removed our transgressions from us." Ps 103:11-12

5. He washes away our guilt and cleanses us from our sin. (Ps. 51:2; Isa. 1:18).

6. He throws all our sins behind His back (Isa. 38:17).

7. He sweeps away our transgressions (lsa 43:25; 44:22).

8. He remembers our sins no more (Isa. 43:25; Jer. 31:34; Heb. 8:12; 10:16-17).

Is 43:25 "I, even I, am he who blots out your transgressions, for my own sake, and remembers your sins no more."

9. He casts all our sins into the depths of the sea (Mic. 7:18-19).

10. He nailed our sin debt to the cross (Col. 2:14).



Titus 3:5-7 "he saved us, not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to his own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit, 6 whom he poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, 7 so that being justified by his grace we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life."

Ro 5:12a "Through one man sin entered into the world, and death through sin."

Ro 5:14 "Death reigned from Adam until Moses, even over those who had not sinned in the likeness of the offense of Adam."

V18 "Therefore, as one trespass led to condemnation for all men, so one act of righteousness leads to justification and life for all men."

1. One is our sinful nature that enslaves us to sin, and the other is

2. Our original guilt and condemnation that is rooted not first in our individual sinning but in our connection with Adam in his sin.

Ro 5:20-21 "20 Now the law came in to increase the trespass, but where sin increased, grace abounded all the more, 21 so that, as sin reigned in death, grace also might reign through righteousness leading to eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord."

5:21 "So that, as sin reigned in death, even so grace would reign through righteousness to <u>eternal life</u> through Jesus Christ our Lord."

Ro 5:1-2 "Therefore, having been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom also we have obtained our introduction by faith into this grace in which we stand; and we exult in hope of the glory of God."
